

4C's of the SPRP

Convene, Catalyze, Coordinate and Collaborate

The Saskatoon Poverty Reduction Partnership (SPRP) creates an annual work plan that focuses on 4 C's (Convene, Catalyze, Coordinate and Collaborate) while governed using a [constellation model](#) with a [collective impact approach](#) (including a common agenda, mutually reinforcing activities, shared measurement, and a backbone agency).

Annually the team reviews the work to ensure that the coordinator contract is fulfilling the deliverables to achieve the common goal - Working towards a poverty free Saskatoon.

While this goal is lofty - the 2019 launch of the [12 Bold Ideas to Eliminate Poverty](#) further identified the interconnectedness required to achieve the goal. In 2021, as we emerge from a COVID pandemic with a new reality, the urgency to work collectively to address ongoing and new circumstances around poverty is heightened.

The following is a high level overview of the 2021 work plan for the SPRP Coordinator. A detailed Gantt chart is provided to the management team monthly. If you want to discuss details of the plan further please connect directly with Colleen (coordinator) and/or Amanda (co-chair).

The 4Cs are interconnected and often work falls into more than one of these categories - but in general the SPRP focuses on bringing people together, collective problem solving, collaborative and innovative resourcing and ensuring that information is provided to partners.

Convene - The SPRP is committed to bringing community partners to the table to discuss the complexities of poverty in Saskatoon.

Catalyze - The SPRP is committed to acting as a catalyst to accelerate and/or start a cause, an action or process. Understanding that the work follows the energy.

Coordinate - The SPRP is committed to organizing and facilitating the sharing of information and resources so that we can accomplish our deliverables.

Collaborate - The SPRP is committed to the inclusive engagement of people in order to create an environment conducive for achieving the common agenda of poverty elimination in Saskatoon.

Collaboration refers to the **engagement of people** in order to **create an environment** conducive for **solving complex issues** with **plausible solutions** for which **they take responsibility** – and **catalyze** the contributions and **assets** of stakeholders into **action**.
